### **Beloved parishioners:**

**“Why do you seek the living one among the dead?” (Lk. 24:5)?**

At the heart of Christian faith is the paschal mystery—Jesus’ life, death and resurrection. But the events we celebrate at Easter do not belong only to the past. On Easter Sunday the past, present and future come together.

Easter celebration calls to mind St. Augustine’s hymn to GOD the BEAUTY: ever ancient, ever new.

The Gospel, God's Good News, tells us that at the door of the tomb, the realm of death, the women hear an affirmation of life: He is not here, but he has been raised. This proclamation, which is the foundation of Christian belief, is echoed through the centuries until the end of time.

The women who had followed Jesus from Galilee to the cross (Lk 8:1-3; 23:55) come to perform burial rites in love and devotion. They are greeted by two figures in white (the number of required legal witnesses), who announce the astounding news of the resurrection; the heavenly beings asked: **“Why do you seek the living one among the dead?”** (Lk. 24:5)?

The messengers then summon the women to an act of remembrance of Jesus' words of the suffering and the crucifixion of the Son of Man. Only after remembering this, the women have become heralds of the Good News: The Lord's death and resurrection, the core announcement of the Gospel.

Through his glorious resurrection, Jesus' prophetic words are fulfilled. The enduring power of his words reverberates through the resurrection appearances, as the risen Jesus himself will break open the Scriptures for his followers.

Faith in the resurrection today is not simply an affirmation of Jesus' victory over death and of his exaltation and enduring presence; it is a summons to return to the words and deeds of Jesus in the Gospel, and have a personal experience of Christ's presence.

Christian faith does not rest on an empty tomb, but on the continuing experience of the risen one. The resurrection proclamation summons the disciples to remember not only the powerful words and deeds of Jesus, but his suffering and death. It also summoned them to be witnesses to this new reality through radical transformation and righteousness.

The message of resurrection, ever ancient, ever new is that Christ is not here: He does not inhabit the realm of the dead, but has emptied death of its power.

Christians today are called to live, proclaim and celebrate this victory by resisting all those forms of death and violence that saturate our culture.

The flowers that adorn our homes and churches this Easter came from seeds that died and were transformed, just as Christian life can flower through the mystery of the cross. We know that while our struggle is life-long, ultimate victory is assured.

Easter Sunday is a day of jubilation par excellence, because it is the day of victory of life over death, a day the Lord has made and will endure forever.

### **Topic 1:**

St Maron's celebration was very successful and enjoyable.

The visit of St. Charbel's Relics needed better preparation and more rehearsal.

### **Topic 2:**

It was expected that some members from our parish will join St. Charbel's Order on the occasion of the relics' visit. We didn't have any. We are still looking for a coordinator for the order from our parish.

### **Topic 3:**

The Fire Department inspected the church and the hall buildings and gave us a list of updates and requirements to be done within one month period. There was a charge of \$95 for the inspection. Father Elie worked with Nabil Bahri, Gaby Hitti and Tony Mahfoud to comply with all requirements.

**Topic 4:**

Two meatless dinners are scheduled for two Fridays during Lent: On Friday March 4, sponsored by Mrs. Youstra Freigeat and on Friday March 18 sponsored by Mrs. Therese Assi.

**Topic 5:**

Abouna suggested that an annual event of kibbee sale be initiated in our parish to take place in March. The sale is to be prepared by the ladies of our parish in a joint effort. This year the Kibbee preparation will take place at the hall on the second week of March.

The annual Maamoul preparation will take place on March 17.

**Topic 6:**

The kibbee sale will take place on the second Sunday of March (March 13) and a Lunch will be served after Mass that will consist of Kibbee, salad, and Laban b khyar (Yogurt with cucumber).

**Topic 7:**

(Part of this collection is sent through the USCCB to the Holy Land and another part is sent directly to the Maronite Eparchy of Haifa.)

(This collection is used for Missions in the USA. Our Eparchy has received large grants from the USCCB from this collection for several years.)
- May 1, 2016

(The entire collection is sent to the Holy Father for him to assist with emergency financial assistance to aid the most needy throughout the world.)

**Assessments will be divided into 10 segments to be paid at the beginning of each month from February through November (inclusive).**

(Note that the following three collections, authorized by the USCCB, are **not** taken in our Eparchy: Campaign for Human Development, Retirement Fund for Religious, The Church in Africa, Black and Indian Missions, and the Archdiocese for Military Services.)

## **Policy for the use of Saint Charbel Hall** (Page 1)

The Hall capacity is 160 people (Provided dance space).

- 1- Security deposit/Registration in the amount of \$400 is required upon registration for the hall. This deposit is refundable after damage assessment.
- 2- In case of cancellation, a notification is requested at least two weeks ahead of the event; otherwise half of the registration fee will not be refunded.
- 3- The fees for the use of the hall are in accordance to the number of occupants for the event and the hours of operation:  
Up to 75 people: \$650 / Up to 100 people: \$750  
Up to 130: \$850 / Up to 160: \$950
- 4- Any damage occurring to the hall or to any artifacts within the perimeter of said property will be deducted from the security deposit. Debris from food and drink including candy wrappers etc. must be disposed of properly. Cans and bottles should be emptied and recycled; no liquids should be trashed in garbage bags. Damages exceeding the security deposit will be the responsibility of the undersigned.
- 5- The hall is and shall remain a smoke free environment. Remains from smoking are to be kept in proper containers outside of the building.
- 6- The hall is to be evacuated by 11:45 PM. A charge of \$100 will be added when that time is exceeded.
- 7- Decoration attached with tapes or tacks on walls and / or drapery, removing items from walls, the use of confetti, standing on chairs and tables, are strictly prohibited. Decorations on tables and suspending from the ceiling are allowed.
- 8- An additional fee in the amount of \$200 is to be charged for food preparation in the kitchen.
- 9- Table linens are available if desired; fees are negotiable.
- 10- Additional fees will apply for cleaning and garbage disposal.

\* **Attention:** Set up and decorations should take place the same day of event, if needed to be done one day in advance or to take more than five hours, an additional charge will apply. In case of the preparation of food in the kitchen takes more than four hours or needed to be done a day before, an additional charge will apply also.

Respectful communication should be observed to the landlord at all times and strict adherence to the rules above.





## Saint Charbel Order

Bishop Gregory Mansour has asked all clergy in the Eparchy of Saint Maron to assist in enriching the order of Saint Charbel both spiritually and on the level of involvement.

The order of Saint Charbel, established in 1980, is an organization of lay people and clergy who have pledged their spiritual strength and financial support to the Eparchy of Saint Maron of Brooklyn.

Its first objective is to direct financial assistance towards educating the seminarians of our Eparchy.

When it will be possible the second objective is to provide additional benefits to our retired clergy in order for them to live with dignity and make it easier for them to share the wisdom of their years.

One way in sharing in the Order's objectives is to become a member. There are two forms of membership annual and perpetual. All billing comes from the Chancery Office and is paid to the Chancery.

### Annual Membership

An Annual Member is one who pledges to donate \$500.00 annually or four equal installments of \$125.00 yearly (yearly membership starts from the month you join).

### Perpetual Membership

A Perpetual member is one who makes a one-time donation of \$5,000 to the Order's Trust Fund. Perpetual members can choose to make four equal installments over a one-year period.
